Purpose:

California American Water requests authority pursuant to Decision 16-09-021, General Order (GO) 96-B, Water Industry Rules, Section 7.3.1, and Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to

offset purchased water expenses it incurs from the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District related to the Pure Water Monterey project.

In accordance with Section 4.3 of General Order No. 96-B, a copy of this advice letter is being sent to those entities listed in Exhibit 1.

Background:

1) Advice Letter 1298 – Tier 1 Filing for soft cap of \$1,720 per AF at a company allotment of 3,500 AF per year.

Submission of these tariffs is made in compliance with Ordering Paragraph 1 of Decision (D.)16-09-021, issued September 22, 2016 which states:

1. *California-American Water Company (Cal-Am) is authorized to enter into the Revised Water Purchase Agreement contained in Appendix C.*

The Revised Water Purchase Agreement (RWPA) (Attachment A) provides that in the first year following the Performance Start Date the Company Water Rate shall not exceed a soft cap of \$1,720 per AF. On June 12, 2020 California American Water filed Advice Letter 1298 to implement a purchased water offset surcharge based on the Company Water Rate of \$1,720 per AF and a company allotment of 3,500 AF per year as provided in the RWPA. The RWPA further provides that if the first year Company Water Rate exceeds the soft cap California American Water shall apply to the CPUC through a Tier 2 advice letter for approval of such rate before the Company shall be required to pay an amount greater than the soft cap as the company water rate.

Written notice of the Company Water Rate was provided to California American Water on April 29, 2020 (Attachment B). In this notice, MPWMD and Monterey One Water (collectively “the public agencies”) informed California American Water the Company Water Rate would be set at \$1,720 per AF for the Tier 1 advice letter filing per the RWPA. Based on this direction California American Water filed Advice Letter 1298 to establish the Company Water Rate at \$1,720 per AF in conformance with the Commission approved RWPA.

2) Advice Letter 1311 – Tier 2 Filing for soft cap exceedance at \$2,442 per AF and a company allotment of 2,300 AF for Fiscal Year 2020-2021.

As noted in AL 1298, the public agencies also informed California American Water that year one water purchase costs will exceed the soft cap of \$1,720 per AF. In the April 29, 2020 notice, California American Water was advised the projected Company Water Rate had increased to \$2,442 for FY 2020-21, and \$2,639 for 2021-2022. From April to August 2020, California American Water worked with the public agencies to obtain the information needed to support the projected increased Company Water Rate for FY 2020-21. This information is provided as Attachment C to this Advice Letter.

In addition to informing California American Water of the higher rate, the public agencies apprised the Company that they will be unable to meet the company allocation of 3,500 AF in FY '20-'21. The RWPA allows for the pro rata computation of the company allotment based on a partial Fiscal Year. In this instance, with the first (partial) Fiscal Year from September 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, the company allotment of 3,500 AF is 2,905 AF. In consultation with the public agencies, California American Water has determined the Pure Water Monterey project will not meet 2,905 AF and will provide approximately 2,300 AF for FY '20-'21.

As shown in Attachment C, the revised water rate of \$2,442 per AF is based on total water production of 3,700 AF per year and not the planned delivery of 2,300 AF per year, which will result in under-collection of project operation and maintenance expenses, and indicates a true cost of \$3,928 per AF. The public agencies have indicated that resulting project operation and maintenance expense under-collection will be included in subsequent years "true-up" per the RWPA. As provided in the RWPA, such "true-up" shall mean: if actual Project Operation and Maintenance Expenses are more or less than budgeted Project Operation and Maintenance Expenses used to calculate the Company Water Rate paid during the Fiscal Year, a corresponding adjustment (up or down) will be provided against the subsequent Fiscal Year budget and computed Company Water Rate for that Fiscal Year. Therefore future water rates likely will exceed forecasted budgets.

Because the company allotment of 3,500 AF will not be met, the offset requested in this filing represents an annual decrease of \$405,474 or -0.53% from the latest revenue requirement approved by the Commission in the Monterey Purchased Water Offset (AL 1298). The resulting decrease of \$0.1080 per hundred cubic feet (ccf) or \$0.0144 per hundred gallons (cgl) is deducted from the current surcharge of \$1.6121 per hundred cubic feet (ccf) or \$0.2155 per hundred gallons (cgl) for an updated surcharge of \$1.5041 per hundred cubic feet (ccf) or \$0.2011 per hundred gallons (cgl). As noted above, California American Water anticipates that the public agencies will need to true-up an anticipated under-collection in the future.

Request:

California American Water Company requests authorization to implement a purchased water surcharge totaling \$1.5041 per ccf (\$0.2011 per 100 gallons) for Monterey Service Area customers.

Tier Designation:

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 2 designation.

Effective Date:

California American Water requests an effective date on or about October 21, 2020.

Notice:

Notice is not required prior to the effective date per General Order 96B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(7). California American Water will provide notice of the adjusted rate with implementation of the surcharge through bill message.

4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
or
5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.
7. A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.
