ADVICE LETTER NO. 1316

TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

California-American Water Company (U210W) hereby submits for review this advice letter, including the following attached tariff sheets applicable to its California Districts:

Purpose:

The purpose of this filing is to comply with ordering Paragraph 41 of Decision (D.) 18-12-021, provide an information only accounting of conservation collections and expenditures for 2018 and 2019, and explain how any over collected conservation balances for the period of 2018 through 2020 will flow back to customers.

Additionally, California American Water requests to cease the conservation surcharge effectively immediately across all service areas.

Background:

D.18-12-021 was issued on December 21, 2018 nearly one year after the scheduled rate implementation date of January 1, 2018. Ordering Paragraph 41 of D. 18-12-021 provides

California-American Water Company (Cal-Am) is authorized to shift authorized conservation budget amounts between best management practice rate categories within a service area. Cal-Am shall continue to track conservation expenses in the one-way California American Water Conservation Surcharge Balancing Accounts with any unspent funds refunded to ratepayers on an annual basis after the end of each year of the General Rate Case cycle. Cal-Am shall file a Tier 2 advice letter no later than 45 days after the end of each year providing an accounting of conservation funds spent with supporting documentation, as well as a proposal to refund to customers any unspent budgeted funds.

California American Water filed advice letter 1225 on February 15, 2019 in compliance with Ordering Paragraph 41. Due to the delay in the decision and corresponding implementation filings ordered in D.18-12-021, the conservation surcharges were not implemented until May 11, 2019. California American did not make the second annual compliance filing on February 15, 2020 because an accounting of conservation funds and any unspent budgeted funds could not be prepared. Through discussions with the Commission's Water Division, California American Water agrees to submit this informational-only filing with an accounting of conservation expense through 2019 and revenue collections from May 11, 2019 through December 31, 2019. Additionally, California American Water will make its final compliance filing by February 15, 2021, no later than 45 days after the end of the year, and will provide a final accounting and make any applicable refunds for the period covering 2018 through 2020.

Finally, through this filing California American Water requests to cease the conservation surcharge across all service areas statewide.

Request:

Information only filing regarding compliance with Ordering Paragraph 41 of D.18-12-021.

Cease the conservation surcharge across all service areas.

Tier Designation:

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

Effective Date:

As to the only filing regarding compliance with Ordering Paragraph 41 of D.18-12-021, California American Water does not request a specific effective date because this is a compliance filing that does not require any changes to California American tariffs.

As to the request to cease the conservation surcharge across all service areas, California American requests an effective date of November 23, 2020.

Protests and Responses:

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter.

A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material errors or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission).

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:
