ADVICE LETTER NO. 76-S

TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

California-American Water Company (California American Water) (U210W) submits this advice letter, including the following attached tariffs applicable to its wastewater service areas.

Purpose:

This advice letter filing requests triggering the Cost of Capital Adjustment Mechanism (“CCM”) and revising the capital structure based on the D.23-06-025 for rates effective January 1, 2024. These revisions will be incorporated in this filing.

Background:

The Commission issued D.23-06-025 on June 29, 2023, which continued California American Water’s CCM¹ and authorized an 8.98% return on equity and a 4.35% cost of debt with a 42.96% debt to 57.04% equity ratio resulting in a 6.99% return on rate base for the calendar years 2022, 2023, and 2024.²

On June 30, 2023, California American Water filed Advice Letter 1415 with the Commission which triggered the CCM for 2023 rates. California American Water requested authorization to trigger the CCM and adjust its ROE to 9.50% and its cost of debt to 4.28%, for an overall rate of return of 7.26% as authorized by D.23-06-025. On July 31, 2023, California American Water filed Advice Letter 75-S, which implemented new rates based on the new Cost of Capital and the Trigger Mechanism filed in Advice Letter 1415, consistent with D.23-06-025. Water Division approved both advice letter filings, for rates effective July 31, 2023.

Through this filing, California American Water requests authorization to trigger the CCM for rates effective January 1, 2024.

The purpose of the CCM is to provide for an automatic adjustment, up or down as the case may be, to California American Water’s adopted return on equity (“ROE”). This mechanism is triggered only if there is a positive or negative difference of more than 100 basis points between the 12-month average Moody’s utility bond rates for the current period ending September 30th versus the benchmark period ending September 30th. If the 100 basis point “deadband” is exceeded, California American Water’s return on equity will be adjusted by one half of the difference between the benchmark and the October 1 to September 30 average. Additionally, the mechanism provides for updates to long-term debt and preferred stock costs to reflect actual August month-end embedded costs and forecasted interest rates for variable long-term debt and new long-term debt and preferred stock-scheduled to be issued. In any year where the 12-month October through September “deadband” is exceeded the current year becomes the new benchmark going forward.

The applicable index is the Moody's Baa utility bond index. The 12-month average of the Moody's Baa utility bond index for the benchmark period October 1 through September 30th, 2022 was 4.38%. The 12-month average of the Moody's Baa utility bond index for the current period October 1 through September 30th, 2023 was 5.78%. The difference of 140 basis points exceeded the CCM "deadband" and the CCM was triggered. As a result, California American Water's authorized ROE is adjusted by one half of the difference, or 70 basis points, for an updated authorized ROE of 10.20%. Additionally, updates to long-term debt and forecasted interest rates for new long-term debt scheduled to be issued provide an updated cost of debt of 4.33%. Based on the authorized capital structure, which is unchanged by the CCM, the updated authorized overall rate of return is 7.68%.

Preliminary assessment of revenue impacts are shown in the table below.

Additionally, since the "deadband" was exceeded the current period October 1, 2022 through September 30th, 2023 becomes the new benchmark period for the CCM going forward.

Request:

California American Water requests authorization to trigger the CCM and adjust its ROE to 10.20% and its cost of debt to 4.33%, for an overall rate of return of 7.68% as authorized by D.23-06-025. These adjustments are incorporated into this filing for rates effective January 1, 2024. Additionally, California American Water seeks authority to establish the period October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023 as the benchmark period for the CCM going forward. California American Water intends to file a 2024 Interim Rate advice letter filing in early December. Each of these filings will be for rates effective January 1, 2024 which will mean customers will just see one rate change on their bills beginning in 2024 in order to reduce customer confusion.

These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order No.96-B and this advice letter is

submitted with a Tier 2 designation.

Effective Date:

California American Water requests an effective date of January 1, 2024.

1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.
7. A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.
